What is the Fish about? Read on and find out! April 1st is April Fool's Day and is also known as All Fool's

Day or Foolish Day. This is a day to play practical jokes and pranks on your friends and family. The origins of April Fool's Day remain mysterious today, but there are a few events in history that may have played a role in establishing the celebration. It is possible that April Fool's Day is related to the festival of Hilaria in Ancient Rome, which took place at the end of March. During these celebrations, people would disguise themselves in masquerades, play games, and play practical jokes on others such as sending them on Fool's Errands, a task that would have no purpose other than to deceive. There is also a connection between April Fool's Day and the March/Vernal Equinox, which marks the arrival of spring. In the past, people thought that Mother Nature was fooling them with unpredictable weather. April Fool's Day could also be related to the adoption of the Gregorian Calendar. In the year 1582, France officially changed their calendars from the Julian Calendar to the Gregorian Calendar. It is believed that the news of this change didn't travel to everyone, and some people weren't too happy with the change, thus many continued to celebrate the new year at the end of March into April 1st, instead of on the date that marked the new year, January 1st. These people became the target of many jokes and pranks, and others would begin to mock them when they saw them. The most popular one was that of the "April Fish", where a person would have a fish taped onto their back to symbolize that they were a young and gullible person.




The holiday of Passover fal



During the 2022 – 2023 Columbian Year, the Supreme Council introduced the *Cor* Initiative and piloted it in various jurisdictions within the K of C. After a successful pilot period, this initiative was brought out Order wide for 2023 – 2024.

Cor is the Latin word for heart, and a Cor group comes together to give the participants an opportunity to grow closer to Jesus, the heart of our faith, through prayer, formation and fraternity. During this Columbian Year 15 separate Cor groups have already been formed in New York, including here in our Council. Corpus Christi's Cor group held its first meeting in May and by the time of the publication of the July Clarion we will have held our June gathering.

All Catholic men, regardless of membership in the K of C, are invited and welcome to participate in our Cor group. We are currently set up to meet on the 4th Thursday of each month at 7:00 p.m. in the "Blue Room" of St Aidan's Convent. The Convent is the building directly behind the St Aidan school building adjacent to the church.

What parish can't benefit from a group of Catholic men regularly coming together for prayer, brotherhood and formation, and who among us can't benefit from participation in such a group.


Why not plan to join us for one of our upcoming meetings – it will be 1½ hour of time well spent.

Tax Day falls on **April 15**th, and it is the last day for people in the US to declare their income tax details with the Internal Revenue Service. This day has been the deadline for filing tax returns since 1955, and it has only been extended a few times due to extenuating circumstances or when it coincided with holidays.



On April 14, 1865, Abraham Lincoln, the 16th President of the United States, was assassinated at his theatre box in Ford's Theatre in Washington D.C., while watching a production of *Our American Cousin*. His attacker was a Confederate sympathizer and famous actor, John Wilkes Booth. President

Lincoln passed away the next day, only six days after the end of the American Civil War, which saw the Confederate Army surrendering. Lincoln was the first American president to be assassinated while in office.




Jackie Robinson Day is celebrated on April 15th in Major League Baseball to commemorate and honor the debut of Jackie Robinson's Major League and the beginning of Robinson's first season in the major leagues. It is celebrated at MLB ballparks and all players, coaches, and managers of both teams including the umpires wear Jersey number 42 in honor of Robinson's number.



Emancipation Day is observed on April 16th and commemorates the day in 1862, when President Lincoln signed the Compensated Emancipation Act. It effectively abolished slavery in the District of

Columbia. However, Slavery only came to an end in other parts of the US in 1865.



Holy Thursday, also referred to as Maundy Thursday, is a holy day that takes place on the Thursday before Easter. It celebrates Jesus's Last Supper with his apostles, which Catholics remember when they take communion, as well as Jesus washing his disciples' feet. Holy Thursday is the fifth day of Holy Week. It marks the beginning of the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ.



Good Friday, or Holy Friday, is celebrated on April 18th. This is the Friday before Easter and commemorates the crucifixion of Jesus Christ. Churches around the globe become still, individuals pay tribute to Jesus's journey, his suffering and the ultimate sacrifice he made for humanity. It is a day to consider the idea of selflessness and reflect how our actions and words can impact others. Good Friday encourages us to rethink life's deeper meanings and values that transcend religious boundaries, be it through prayer, contemplation or just moments of stillness.






Holy Saturday is the third day of the Sacred Paschal Triduum and it is the Saturday before Easter Sunday. The Easter Vigil begins between sunset on Holy Saturday and sunrise on Easter Sunday. This day marks the end of Holy Week and the 40-day

Lenten season, a time for reflection and anticipation before the joyful celebration of Christ's resurrection on Easter.






Easter Sunday is the end of the Passion of Christ, which begins with the 40 days of lent, symbolizing the days that Jesus spent in the desert being tempted by the Devil. It culminates in Holy Week during which Jesus was crucified. The Holy Triduum

consists of Holy Thursday where Jesus had his Last Supper, Good Friday was when Jesus was crucified and Easter Sunday, which was the day of his resurrection.

Easter Sunday is celebrated on the first Sunday after the first full moon after the spring equinox which marks the resurrection of Jesus Christ, a pivotal event that is the foundation of the Catholic faith and a celebration of hope and new life.





Patriots' Day is observed on the 3rd Monday of April, and it commemorates the Battle of Lexington

and the Battle of Concord which took place on April 19, 1775. These and were the first battles fought in the American Revolutionary War. 2024 will mark the 250th anniversary of the battle! This day is not to be confused with Patriot Day, which happens on September 11th, and remembers the anniversary of the attack on the World Trade Center.



The Spanish American War was an armed conflict between Spain and America that started on April 21, 1898 and ended with Spain being expelled from the Americas, and the United States taking over the territories that previously belonged to the Spanish, in Latin America and the western Pacific.




Earth Day is celebrated internationally on April 22nd. It is a day to educate people about the issues affecting our planet and to raise awareness for and celebrate the efforts in place to protect the environment. As a global observance, it sometimes extends to a week-long celebration, named Earth Week, and the celebrations are coordinated by the Earth Day Network across 193 countries.

America usually celebrates **Arbor Day** on the **last Friday of April.** However, states are free to choose their own commemorative dates considering the best environment for trees to prosper.

The idea of Arbor Day originated in the 1870s in Nebraska. Julius Sterling Morton was a journalist who moved to the state in 1854. He and his wife together bought 160 acres of land for their property. They planted several trees and shrubbery throughout this barren property. Morton, as the new editor for the Nebraska City News, found the perfect opportunity to spread awareness about the importance of trees in the ecosystem. This made Nebraskans realize how barren and void of greenery the state is. Soon after, Morton became a part of the Nebraska Board of Agriculture. In 1872, he suggested a dedicated day should be created for planting trees. The board accepted his proposal from him and Arbor Day was born.

The first-ever Arbor Day took place on April 10, 1872, with several dedicated Nebraskans participating and planting around 1 million trees. The board also promised prizes for those who planted trees correctly and this encouraged them even more. Arbor Day became an official state holiday in Nebraska in 1885 and was to be observed on April 22nd, in honor of Morton's birthday. It wasn't until 1970 that the day was recognized on a national scale by President Nixon.

If you are asking, "Why are trees so important?" Trees are important for the survival of the planet and are commonly known as the Earth's lungs. They provide shelter to many animals, mainly birds, and the source of materials that are essential for human living, such as paper, cork, and sap.

On Feb. 22, 1900, the first Fourth Degree exemplification was held for 1,100 candidates at the Lenox Lyceum in New York City. With the promotion of the new degree,
