## Mike Curley, Chancellor

The Belmont Stakes, also known as The Run for the Carnations and The Test of the Champion, is held on the first Saturday of June, the 7<sup>th</sup>, in New York, at Belmont Park.



It is the third race of the Triple Crown. This year the race will be run upstate at Saratoga Racecourse. The 157<sup>th</sup> running of the Belmont Stakes will feature a \$2 million purse. It is a Grade I stakes horse race for three-year-old thoroughbreds, and at 1.5 miles, Belmont Stakes has the longest racetrack of the three events in the Triple Crown. Nonetheless, the distance at Saratoga is 1.24 miles, 10 furlongs or 2012 meters.



**Pentecost**, also known as Whitsunday, is one of the most important Catholic feast days which has its origins in the Judaism tradition of the Festival of Weeks and **takes place fifty days after Easter**. It marks the end of the Easter season and is seen as the "birthday of the Church". Pentecost commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon

the Jesus's apostles, after his ascension into heaven as described in the Acts of the Apostles.

During the 2022 – 2023 Columbian Year, the Supreme Council introduced the *Cor* Initiative and piloted it in various jurisdictions within the K of C. After a successful pilot period, this initiative was brought out Order wide for 2023 – 2024.

Cor is the Latin word for heart, and a Cor group comes together to give the participants an opportunity to grow closer to Jesus, the heart of our faith, through prayer, formation and fraternity. During this Columbian Year 15 separate Cor groups have already been formed in New York, including here in our Council. Corpus Christi's Cor group held its first meeting in May and by the time of the publication of the July Clarion we will have held our June gathering.

All Catholic men, regardless of membership in the K of C, are invited and welcome to participate in our Cor group. We are currently set up to meet on the 4<sup>th</sup> Thursday of each month at 7:00 p.m. in the "Blue Room" of St Aidan's Convent. The Convent is the building directly behind the St Aidan school building adjacent to the church.

Father's Day will be celebrated on June 15<sup>th</sup> this year.



Father's Day is celebrated annually on the **third Sunday of June**. It is a day to recognize and honor fathers and the crucial role they play in people's lives, from childhood through to adulthood.



**Trinity Sunday,** specifically the **Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity,** is observed on the Sunday following Pentecost.



It's a day dedicated to the doctrine of the Trinity. Trinity Sunday is a day of Solemnity. The feast was officially established by Pope John XXII in the 14<sup>th</sup> century.

On **Juneteenth**, **June 19<sup>th</sup>**, America celebrates Freedom Day. This is the anniversary of the Emancipation Proclamation that abolished slavery in Texas and other former Confederate states in 1865. **Juneteenth** is a US federal holiday.



The feast of Corpus Christi will be celebrated on June 19<sup>th</sup>. It is observed every year on the Thursday after Trinity Sunday.



Corpus Christi is a Latin term that literally translates to 'body of Christ'. It is believed that the bread and wine used during holy communion, or The Eucharist represents the actual body and blood of Jesus Christ. It is a special way of celebrating and feeling the presence of Jesus on earth.

The **Summer Solstice** in the **Northern Hemisphere will occur on June 20<sup>th</sup> at 10:42 PM EDT**. It marks the longest day of the year and the arrival of the summer season.



The Summer Solstice generally occurs between June 20<sup>th</sup> and June 22<sup>nd</sup>. The solstice happens when the Earth arrives at the point where the North Pole is at its maximum tilt in relation to the sun. This is why days are longer during the Summer Solstice. On the other hand, in the Southern Hemisphere, the Summer Solstice occurs around December 21<sup>st</sup> or 22<sup>nd</sup>.

Helen Keller Day is commemorated annually on her birthday, June 27<sup>th</sup>. It is a day to remember her achievements in life, and her resilience when overcoming challenges

Hellen Keller was an author, activist, lecturer, and advocate for people with disabilities, being deafblind herself. This commemorative holiday is wellknown for the fundraising fashion show that is held on this day.


Helen Keller was born on June 27, 1880, in Alabama. When she was only 19 months old, she contracted an illness that left her deaf and blind.



After taking her to a specialist doctor, her parents were advised to contact Alexander Graham Bell, who then instructed them to take Helen to the Perkins Institute for the Blind. There, the school director introduced them to Anne Sullivan, 20 years old and blind herself, who would become Keller's tutor and lifelong companion. It was Sullivan who first taught Keller how to spell and write, by making her trace the spelling of the names of different objects with her fingers on the palms of her hands. Despite her first delays in picking up the language, Keller went on to pursue higher education. In 1900, she was accepted into Harvard University. In 1904, at 24 years old, Helen Keller was the first deaf-blind person to graduate with a Bachelor of Arts degree. Through her education, she learned to speak, and much of her life was spent giving lectures and speeches about her life and raising awareness about the disabilities of those that are deaf and/or blind.

She then went on to become an internationally renowned speaker, author, advocate, and suffragette traveling to over 40 countries in her life. In 1915 she founded Hellen Keller International, an organization that aims to do research in health and vision. She was also a co-founder of the American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU). Helen Keller published 12 books and wrote many articles during her life. She is best known for her autobiography "The Story of My Life", published in 1903. Another famous piece of her writing is the essay "Three Days to See", where Keller imagines what she would do if she could see for three days. After suffering a series of strokes in 1961, Keller was confined to her home for her last years. In 1964 she was awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom by President Lyndon B. Johnson. Hellen Keller passed away in her sleep on June 1, 1968, at the age of 87

National PTSD Awareness Day is observed on June 27<sup>th</sup> each year.



The day is part of PTSD Awareness Month, which is observed in June, to raise awareness about Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder and its impact. The day is an opportunity to educate the public about PTSD, reduce stigma, and encourage support for those affected.

According to many sources the 5 signs of PTSD are:

1.) Experiencing a Trauma - This includes exposure to actual or threatened death, serious injury, or sexual violence, either directly, by witnessing it, or learning about it happening to a loved one.

2.) Re-Experiencing the Trauma - This involves intrusive memories, flashbacks, or nightmares, which can feel like reliving the traumatic event.

3.) Avoidance of Triggers - Individuals with PTSD may avoid thoughts, feelings,

conversations, places, or situations that remind them of the trauma.

4.) Changes in Thoughts and Mood - This can include negative beliefs about oneself or the world, persistent negative emotions like fear,

anger, or guilt, and difficulty remembering
important aspects of the trauma. And
5.) Changes in Arousal and Reactivity - This
includes feeling constantly on edge, being easily
startled, having difficulty concentrating, and
trouble sleeping.

On April 29, 1945, the Nazi concentration camp in Dachau, Germany, was liberated by American forces only hours before it was scheduled to be evacuated and destroyed. Many of the prisoners credited this miraculous liberation to St. Joseph, to whom they had entrusted themselves in their extreme suffering. As an expression of gratitude, they began making annual pilgrimages to St. Joseph's Sanctuary in Kalisz, Poland. ### A Call for Love and Unity

The Church rejoiced on May 18 as Pope Leo XIV was formally installed as 266th Successor of Peter. Tens of thousands gathered in St. Peter's Square for the Mass of Inauguration of the Petrine Ministry. In his <u>homily</u>, the pope emphasized two central themes of his pontificate, rooted in the spirituality of St. Augustine: love and unity. "With the light and the strength of the Holy Spirit," he said, "let us build a Church founded on God's love, a sign of unity, a missionary Church that opens its arms to the world, proclaims the word, allows itself to be made 'restless' by history, and becomes a leaven of harmony for humanity."

Pope Leo XIV greeted the faithful at the conclusion of his inauguration Mass on May 18. He wore a chasuble once used by St. John Paul II, who was born exactly 105 years earlier, and carried the late pope's distinctive ferula.

#### Viva Cristo Rey!

Today we celebrate the feast of the Mexican Martyrs: 25 priests and laymen who gave their lives for their faith during the violent persecution of the Church in Mexico in the 1920s and '30s. Among them are nine Knights of Columbus, including six priest-martyrs whom St. John Paul II canonized 25 years ago today. The Sanctuary of the Martyrs of Christ the King in Guadalajara, constructed with major financial support from the Supreme Council, is the first site to permanently enshrine relics of all the canonized and beatified Mexican martyrs. ### A Fraternity of Arms

A new statue of two World War I leaders, funded in part by the Supreme Council, commemorates the nearly 250 years of military alliance between France and the United States. Marshal Ferdinand Foch, supreme commander of the Allied Forces, and Gen. John J. Pershing, commander of the American Expeditionary Forces, were instrumental in orchestrating the Allied victory in 1918. A devout Catholic, Foch was named an honorary Knight of Columbus during a visit to the U.S. in 1921, and both men expressed admiration for the Order and gratitude for its support of Allied troops. <u>READ</u> MORE

Vincent Spanicciati, a U.S. Marine veteran who served during the Vietnam War and was awarded three Purple Hearts, credits God with guiding him through war and healing. 



"Pope Leo XIV, the first American Pope, assumes the Petrine ministry with a strong familiarity with the Knights of Columbus. I was honored to meet with him in 2023, shortly after the beginning of his tenure as Prefect of the Vatican's Dicastery for Bishops, and I know firsthand of his sincere appreciation for the Knights of Columbus and our service to the Church around the world. 


