We would qualify for a group rate so assume a \$20 fee. Some members do play regularly ... we have some players already interested. We can socialize at the Council after the event (not mandatory).

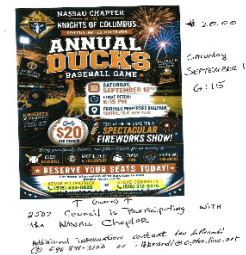

Heart of a Nation

Leading up to the 250th anniversary of the Declaration of Independence on July 4, the U.S. bishops will consecrate the nation to the Sacred Heart of Jesus on June 11, the eve of the solemnity of the Sacred Heart. Knights and their families are encouraged to participate by [praying a novena](#) June 3-11. "Our hope is that greater charity will be exercised throughout our country, and that in the heart of Christ we will rediscover the unity that seems to be slipping away from us in today's divisive culture," said Archbishop Alexander Sample of Portland, Oregon, chairman of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' Committee for Religious Liberty and a longtime Knight. "That in the heart of Christ we will find ourselves to be friends again, even with those with whom we disagree."

Heart of the Nation

Archbishop Alexander Sample of Portland, Oregon, a member of St. Mary's Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception Council 15295 in Portland, recently spoke with *Columbia* about devotion to the Sacred Heart, the upcoming consecration of the United States and the role of religious liberty in American society. The Basilica of the Sagrada Família in Barcelona, which has been under construction since 1882, is a living testament to the architectural vision of Venerable Antoni Gaudí. Gaudí devoted the last 12 years of his life exclusively to the basilica’s design and construction, and 100 years after his death, the world’s tallest church is nearing completion. “A
